all that we are, have been, and shall be is known to you,
to the very secret of our hearts
and all that rises to trouble us.
Living flame burn into us,
cleansing wind, blow through us,

Psalm

JANUARY 12: PSALM 36

Sin speaks to the wicked deep in their heart: there is no fear of God before their eyes.

They flatter themselves in their own sight: that their iniquity will not be found out and hated.

The words of their mouth are mischief and deceit: they have ceased to act wisely and do good.

They plot mischief as they lie in bed: they are set on a source that is not good, and hold back from nothing that is evil.

Your steadfast love, O LORD, extends to the heavens: your faithfulness up to the clouds.

Your righteousness is like the strong mountains, your judgments are like the great deep: you LORD save both people and beasts.

How precious is your steadfast love O God: mortals take refuge in the shadow of your wings.

They feast on the rich abundance of your house: you give them drink from the stream of your delights.

For with you is the well of life: and in your light we see light.

Continue your loving kindness to those who know you: and your justice to the true of heart.

Let not the foot of pride come against me: nor the hand of the wicked drive me away.

There are they fallen, those who do evil: they are thrown down and unable to rise.

JANUARY 19: PSALM 32

Blessed are those whose offences are forgiven: whose sin has been put away.

Blessed are those to whom the LORD imputes no guilt: and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

While I held back from confessing my sin: my body wasted away through my groaning all day long.

For your hand was heavy upon me day and night: I was dried up and withered, as it were by drought in summer.

Then I acknowledged my sin to you: my guilt I did not hide.

I said, 'I will confess my sins to the LORD': and so you forgave the wickedness of my sin.

Therefore let all those that are faithful pray to you in time of trouble: when great flood-water rises, it shall not come near them.

You are a place to hide me in, you will preserve me from trouble: you will surround me with shouts of deliverance.

'I will teach you, and guide you in the way you should go: I will keep you under my eye and give you counsel.

Be not like horse or mule, which have no understanding: whose course must be checked with bit and bridle.

Many pains are in store for the wicked: but whoever trusts in the LORD is surrounded by steadfast love.

Be glad you righteous, and rejoice in the LORD: shout for joy all you that are upright in heart.

JANUARY 26: PSALM 141

LORD I call to you, come quickly to my help: give heed to me when I cry to you.

Let my prayer be set before you as incense: and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.

Set a guard O LORD over my mouth: and keep watch at the door of my lips.

Keep my heart from any sinful inclination, from joining the ill-disposed in their wickedness: and let me never eat at their table.

Rather let the righteous strike me: and give me friendly rebuke, than that the oil of the wicked should anoint my head: for I pray continually against their wickedness.

But my eyes are fixed on you LORD God: in you I take refuge, do not cast me off.

Keep me from the snare they have laid for me: and from the traps evil doers have set.

Let the wicked fall together into their own nets: while I pass by unharmed.

FEBRUARY 2: PSALM 15

LORD, who may be a guest in your house: or who may dwell on your holy mountain?

One who leads a blameless life: who does what is right, and speaks truthfully from the heart,

whose tongue is free from malice, who never wrongs a friend: and utters no reproach against a neighbour,

who does not honour the unworthy: but makes much of those who fear the LORD.

Such a one stands by a promise given: though it be at personal disadvantage,

and will not take interest on a loan: nor accept a bribe to testify against the innocent.

Whoever does all this: shall never be overthrown.

FEBRUARY 9: PSALM 130

Out of the depths have I called to you O LORD: give heed O LORD to my cry.

Let your ears consider well: the plea I make for mercy.

If you should keep account of what is done amiss: who then O LORD could stand?

But there is forgiveness with you: therefore you shall be revered.

I wait for you LORD with all my soul: and in your word is my hope.

My soul waits for you O LORD: more than those who watch by night long for the morning, more I say than those who watch by night long for the morning.

Wait in hope for the LORD, for with the LORD there is love unfailing: and with the LORD there is ample redemption.

The LORD will redeem you: from all your many sins.

Reading

JANUARY 12

Love your enemies. Do good to those who hate you. Bless those who curse you.

Pray for those who abuse you. Do good and lend, expecting nothing in return; for God is kind to the ungrateful and the selfish.

Be merciful as God is merciful. Judge not and you will not be judged. Condemn not and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven.

Give and it will be given to you; for the measure you give will be the measure you receive.

JANUARY 19

Do not ask anxiously, "What are we to eat? What are we to drink? What shall we wear?" The whole world runs after such things. Set your heart and mind on God's commonwealth and justice first, and all the rest will come to you as well. So do not be anxious about tomorrow. Today has enough problems of its own; tomorrow can look after itself.

JANUARY 26

There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and those who are afraid are not perfected in love. We love because God first loved us. If anyone says, I love God, and hates their sibling, that person is a liar; for those who do not love their siblings whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen.

FEBUARY 2

It is the God who said, Let light shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body.
