

I'll be home for Christmas, if only in my dreams...

This Advent–Christmas season at First Baptist Church Halifax (FBCH), we are reflecting on the Holy Family's search for home. Where did Mary, Joseph, and their infant son Jesus call home? The Gospels offer

different portraits—Luke imagines them travelling from Nazareth to Bethlehem for a brief stay, while Matthew describes Bethlehem as their home until displacement forced them to migrate to Egypt.

For many of us, home is just as complex. It may be a place we once lived, a place we yearn for, or a place we hope to find. Even when our address is settled, our sense of home can shift with life's seasons. And for some, home is less about geography and more about the relationships that help us feel grounded—those spaces where we can be fully ourselves, known and loved.

Whatever your story of home may be, our hope is that FBCH contributes to Halifax feeling like a community of belonging. For some, that belonging grows through weekly worship. For others, through gatherings such as our monthly *Sacred Sounds*, *Sacred Silence* series, joining together for justice initiatives, or attending occasional services like tonight's *Carols by Candlelight*. If you're curious about ways to connect more deeply, we invite you to explore our website or socials to learn what is happening in the life of this congregation.

Tonight, as music and candlelight open our hearts, may each of us sense the joy at the centre of Christmas: the good news that God chooses to make a home among us.

where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶ "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." '

⁷ Then Herod secretly called for the magi and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' ⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary, his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

¹³ Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.' ¹⁴Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, ¹⁵and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, 'Out of Egypt I have called my son.'
